INTERESTING PROPERTIES IN EARL'S COURT SQUARE

No. 1	Earl's Court Lodge, the first house to be built in the Square
Nos. 6 - 10	Formerly the Half Moon Hotel
No. 12	Originally ear-marked as a residence for one of Lord Kensington's close female relatives. Formerly the Annex of the White House Hotel. It still retains a conservatory on its porch
Nos. 15 - 19	Formerly the White House Hotel
No. 21	Formerly the home of the National Poetry Society
Nos. 23-25	Formerly Queens Court serviced apartments, which later became Queens Court
Nos. 22-24	Formerly the Envoy Hotel
Nos. 51-55	Formerly Cumberland House and was a nurses home
Nos. 30-52	The Dutch Houses, Grade II* listed
No. 69	Formerly the Admiral Hotel, later became Admiral House
Langham Mansions	Celebrated its 100 centenary in 1995
Herbert Court Mansions	Built 1891-91 and nominated for an architectural award in its day
Wetherby Mansions	Built between 1892 and 1897
Northgate House	Built in 1965 on the site of the builder's yard belonging to No. 1 Earl's Court Square which later was used as a garage to No. 3
No. 326 Earl's Court Road	The site of the Bolton Beer House
