Identity theft scam warning

The Council has been made aware of an attempt to con residents into giving personal details under the guise of receiving a 'council tax adjustment'. In the emails residents are told that, as a result of an adjustment by the Listing Officer of the Valuation Office Agency, their address has been downgraded for council tax purposes and they are entitled to a refund for previous overcharges. In order to obtain a refund residents are asked to scan and send a copy of their

latest council tax bill and also a copy of their UK driving licence or passport. The Council wants to stress that these are not genuine emails and no such council tax adjustment exists. If you have been contacted please do not respond, but instead call the Council on 020 7361 3424.

Annual General Meeting

This will take place on an evening in February next year, the date being given in the Annual Report and Newsletter to be published in January, as well as by notices around the Square.

Membership

There was a slight confusion as a result of the Annual Newsletter being sent out later this year, in May, as membership forms were included. Several members who had already renewed their membership did so again and thank you to those who asked that the second subscription to be treated as a donation. Our membership now stands at 84, including 6 new members, a decrease on last year.

Planning and Property

Planning permission has been granted to build a house on the site of the three garages in the north east arm of the Square.

It will have a basement so there will be disruption in that area once building work commences.

Rubbish and Recycling

Please do *not* place shredded paper in your recycling bag. The small pieces are a fire hazard needing to be removed by hand and can even mean plant having to be shut down for maintenance as it clogs up the equipment. Shredding also shortens the paper fibres so it is not ideal for recycling as the quality of the end product is poor. Keep shredding to a minimum and place it in black bags for general rubbish.

We are pleased to announce that a third litter bin has been erected on a lamppost in the Square, in the south west corner outside St Cuthbert's School.

Traffic and Parking

There have been on-going problems with parents double parking their cars when they come to collect their children in the afternoons from St Cuthbert's school. The south west arm of the Square is the only vehicular entrance and any congestion in that area can cause problems to other traffic trying to turn in from the busy Warwick Road.

We have been advised that there has been an article in the weekly school newsletter about this, encouraging parents to walk to and from school or to park in the Pay and Display bays. We await to see an improvement.

Footpath Renewal

The paving on the north side of Earl's Court Square, adjacent to the Garden, was replaced during August. Despite alarms that the existing York stones might be lost, we were relieved by the reassurance of the Highways department of RBK&C that damaged stones would be replaced by the original style York stones held in stock

Police and Crime

Thanks are due to the good efforts of John Walker, the Council working with local police and the probation service, have used offenders on the Community Payback Service to give the Tardis Police box outside the Earl's Court Road entrance / exit to the underground station a make over. The work was paid for through the local City Living Fund.

The ambient weather helped bring out the displays of food and disco fun at the annual BBQ held for residents in the Garden Square in early July.
